RED EARTH BREWERS TO HOST BJCP TASTING EXAM

For anyone looking to take their beer knowledge and judging credentials to the next level, we've got some exciting news! Brandon Jones has scheduled the first BJCP Tasting Exam in Oklahoma City in several years. This is a fantastic opportunity for both new and experienced beer judges to elevate their expertise. Here are all the important details you need to know:

DATE & TIME:

Sunday, April 13 - Exam starts promptly at 11 AM (please arrive by 10:30 AM for check-in)

LOCATION:

Project 3810 | 3810 N Tulsa Ave, Oklahoma City, OK 73112

EXAM FEES:

- \$40 for first-time examinees
- \$15 for current BJCP judges

REGISTRATION:

The exam is limited to 12 examinees, with spots reserved for the first paid registrations. Be sure to secure your spot early, as registration is on a first-come, first-served basis!

REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS:

To register for the BJCP Tasting Exam, you must meet one of the following requirements:

- 1. Pass the online BJCP entrance exam
- 2. Be a certified BJCP judge

If you haven't yet passed the online exam, you'll need to do so before registering. The online exam costs \$10 for one attempt or \$20 for three attempts. More information and registration can be found here: BJCP Online Entrance Exam.

EXAM PREP COURSE:

Feeling unsure about preparing for the exam? No worries! There is a free online training course available to help you get ready. This course is a great resource to familiarize yourself with the exam format and sharpen your judging skills.

IMPORTANT NOTES:

- After the first week of February, the exam will be publicly announced on social media, so if you wait to register, you may miss your chance to secure a spot.
- The exam is limited to 12 participants, and only those who have passed the online entrance exam or are already BJCP judges are eligible to take it.

Competition are officially open! Get your best brews ready for one of the most exciting homebrewing events of the year. The Final Round will take place in Kansas City, making this year's competition a can't-miss opportunity.

IMPORTANT DATES & DETAILS

Entry Registration & Payment: Jan. 28 – Feb. 19 Log in to your AHA account on the Homebrewers Association website to register. Need help with your login? Click "Forgot Username or Password" to reset your details.

Category Changes & Cancellations: Changes are allowed through March 20, subject to availability. Refunds will not be issued after Feb. 19.

Shipping/Drop-Off Windows:

First Round: March – April 2025 (see below) Final Round: Early to Mid-June 2025 in Kansas City

Entry Fee: \$29 per entry

Eligibility: Entries must be homebrewed beer, mead, or cider. Professional equipment is not allowed—this is a true homebrewing competition.

SUPPORT OTHER HOMEBREW CLUB COMPETITIONS: SIGN UP TO JUDGE!

We're excited to help support other clubs by encouraging our members to sign up as judges for their competitions. Not only does this strengthen connections in the brewing community, but it also ensures we have help when it's time for Spring Brew Off!

Consider a weekend road trip to judge at one of these upcoming events:

<u>Kansas City</u>: Judging runs from Monday, Feb. 17 through Saturday, Feb. 22.

<u>IBU Open in Iowa</u>: Judging starts Monday, March 3 through Saturday, March 8.

Volunteering as a judge is a great way to hone your skills, meet fellow brewers, and give back to the craft beer community. Sign up, hit the road, and make a difference! **Categories:** Use the 2021 BJCP Guidelines for style definitions. This year, seltzers, kombucha, and other alternative fermentations are excluded.

Entry Requirements:

First Round: Submit two (2) bottles to your selected First Round competition site.

Final Round: Advancing entries require three (3) bottles sent to Kansas City. Further instructions will follow after the First Round.

First Round Locations & Judging Dates

Each Location limited to 750 entries

Chicago: Entries received March 24–28; judging April 11–12

Indianapolis: Entries received March 5–15; judging March 28–29

Longmont, CO: Entries received March 31-April 4; judging April 11-12

New York City: Entries received March 10–13; judging March 21–22

San Diego: Entries receivedApril 14–18; judging April 26–27

Seattle: Entries received April 7–10; judging April 11–12 Tampa: Entries received March 3–8; judging March 21–23
